


Outcome of the Event:




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Technical Session III: "NIRF Ranking System"

Further, she elucidated elaborately on NAAC Criteria and Weightages. Different aspects were also given.

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






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DAY 4 – 28.06.2021



The speaker addressed all the possible hybrid models like



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
Topic: PATENT FILING

- Feedback system.











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
Dr. Kanagaraj Eswaran gave insight on the components of research proposal and process of writing a research proposal. The session educated on how research proposal needs to be written.


Write-up about the Event (Max. 150 Words):
