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










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Faculty and Students Exchange Programme

Aim:

This program aim to enhance communications between staff and students.

Through this program, Staff and Students could:

Objective:

- b) Formulate and design different aspects of the Study-Abroad and Study-in-India programs for students.
- c) Formulate and design different aspects of faculty exchange in terms of handling courses and enhance research collaboration in the field of mutual interest.

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The host and home institutions shall seek to promote the Faculty and Student Exchange Programme

a. Faculty Exchanges

- (i) The exchange of faculty to the mutual benefit of both institutions (Home & Host),
- (ii) Collaboration in teaching, research and development, and consultancy studies in the field of mutual interest,
- (iii) The exchange of academic materials and publications,
- (iv) Conducting lectures,
- (v) Undertaking joint research,
- (vi) Attachment of staff for purposes of curriculum development and review, attendance of courses, upgrading of teaching and research skills,
- (vii)Participating in seminars, symposiums, and other types of academic discussions,
- (viii) Co-supervising under- graduate and post-graduate students,
- (ix) Conducting study tours and joint consultancy work.
- (x) Home Institute provide the financial support to a maximum of 2 Exchange Staff
- (xi) Each Exchange Staff shall visit the host Institute for a minimum of 5 working days.
- (xii) Each Exchange Staff will receive a certificate after the visit.
- (xiii) The Staff should not have attended any other student exchange programme during his/her current programme.

b. Students Exchanges


- (i)Exchange students will be selected by mutual agreement between the home institution and the host institution.
- (ii) An exchange student will continue to be treated as full-time student at his/her home institution.
- (iii) An exchange student will be considered as full-time "exchange" student at the host institution.
- (iv)The Staff should not have attended any other student exchange programme during his/her current programme.
- (v) Host Institute offers Extra Credit Course (Minimum 2 Credits), provide orientation, academic advising, extracurricular activities and Cultural exchange etc students should undertake course offered by host institute.
- (vi) The Extra credit will be worked out based on the prevailing norms of UGC.

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


- (vii) The duration of student exchange may be limited to a minimum of 40 Hours (5 Days) to a maximum of 60 Hours (7 Days).
- (viii) Students coming for course work and seeking credits will have to undergo assessments at various stages of the course work at host Institute.
- (ix) Any student will not be allowed to attend the exchange programme after the start of the course.
- (x) The Student should not have attended any other student exchange programme during his/her current programme.
- (xi) 20-25 Students will be permitted a batch
- (xii) The host institution will evaluate an exchange student's performance in course or module, award a certificate to that effect.
- (xiii) The home institution may award to the exchange student credits earned at a host institution.
- (xiv) Students will not be granted certificate till they complete all the academic requirements of course
- (xv) Extra credit course, Industrial visit, local visit and accommodation will be provided by the Host institute and other costs including meals, health insurance/expenditure, etc. will be borne by the student.

c. Other Areas:

- (i) To exchange information on research and educational programs,
- (ii) To exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programs,
- (iii) To jointly organize short-term continuing education programs on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein,
- (iv) To organize jointly seminars, conferences, or workshops on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein,
- (vii) The provision of cultural and intellectual enrichment opportunities for faculty and students of both institutes (Home & Host),
- (viii) To use laboratory facilities in specific cases for a limited period,
- (ix) To permit students and faculty members to use library facility.

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General Terms for the Exchange Programs and requirements.

a) Exchange Student and Staff will be selected by the home Institute.

b) Health and safety conditions in the host institutions may be made known to the students concerned.

c) The Programme offered in English as medium of education

d) The Host Institute will have the sole responsibility for the smooth and successful conduct of

the program.




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


Through this programme CANNY Consortium of Colleges offers 2 Credits Course for the Students of CANNY Consortium of College.




Eligibility

3. Applications are scrutinized by the Screening Committee in respect of eligibility. Eligible applications are then examined by the Nehru Civic Charitable Trust Expert Committee (s). The expert committee/s make(s) recommendation for award of studies and also suggest budget for the recommended studies.
