

Through hard work, firm determination and strict self discipline, he established Nehru College of Aeronautics and Applied Sciences at Kuniamuthur, Coimbatore in 1968. Besides this College, he established four Engineering Colleges, Arts & Science College, Pharmacy College, Aviation Institute, Super Specialty Hospital, three Management Colleges in Tamil Nadu and Kerala. As a young academician, he started his career in 1968 at Coimbatoreand the meteoric rise of this great personality in the field of technical and Higher Education was Phenomenal.

Despite innumerable difficulties and insurmountable obstacles, he forged ahead with firm determination to accomplish success after success. The flagship Institution namely Nehru College of Aeronautics & Applied Sciences has emerged as a unique Institution in this country. This College is the only one with so many specializations in

Aeronautical Maintenance Engineering. In the field of Applied Sciences, several branches for B. Sc. Degree Programme in Aeronautical Engineering, Electronics, Computer Science and Avionics and MBA in Air Line and Airport Management were started there. The quality maintained here speaks volumes about the professional temperament of Founder Chairman Late P. K. Das.

He added a golden feather to his cap, by starting the prestigious Nehru Arts and Science College in a new campus at Thirumalayampalayam. There are 2 Engineering Colleges and 3 Management Colleges at Thirumalayampalayam and Kaliapuram, on the outskirts of Coimbatore.

In another turn of the decade he started Nehru College of Engineering & Research Centre and later on Nehru College of Pharmacy at Pampady in Kerala and Jawaharlal College of Engineering and Technology the first Aeronautical Engineering College in 2008 at Lakkidi Palakkad District and later on Jawaharlal Aviation Institute in 2010. A Super Specialty Hospital named as P. K. Das Institute of Medical Sciences has been established at Vaniyamkulam in his fond memory, with all the facilities on par with world class hospitals. The efficient functioning and quality maintained in these Institutions are testimonies to his diligence and quality consciousness.

Though he left us, about 13 years back, his sons Adv. Dr. P. Krishnadas, the present Chairman and Managing Trustee and Dr. P. Krishnakumar, CEO & Secretary, Nehru Group of Institutions at Coimbatore have been groomed into successful Academicians and Administrators. The Chairman had foreseen the birth of a great University in the name of Nehru University.

CODE OF CONDUCT

General Rules

The medium of instruction is English for all Programmes conducted by the college

- College functions from Monday to Friday
- Working Hours: 9:25 am to 4:00 pm
- The periods in the Morning and Afternoon sessions are of 50 minutes in duration.
- · Students should wear their ID card inside the campus.
- Students should wear the prescribed uniform on three days. (Monday, Wednesday and Friday)
- · Boys and girls should wear Formal Shoes. Boys should tuck in their shirts.
- Students are expected to conduct themselves in an exemplary manner and have true
 pride and dignity in themselves and earn a good name for the college.
- · Students are expected to be courteous and polite in their approach.
- Students are encouraged to take part in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.
- Students should abide by the discipline and decorum of the College
- Students should maintain discipline in the campus. A discipline committee
 appointed by the principal will enquire into any incident of the report of students'
 indiscipline and recommend suitable action to be taken.
- · Students are suggested to meet Principal with prior appointment.
- The vehicle of the students should be parked in the allotted parking place.
- Usage of Gadgets is strictly prohibited.
- Student should see the Notice Board daily without fail to keep in touch with the important instructions from the authorities of the College.

- Among the Students, no society, association or club shall be formed without the prior written permission from the Principal
- Celebrations of any kind without prior written permission from the Management are prohibited in the campus. Violation of the above will be viewed seriously.
- Regular reports will be sent to Parents / Guardians regarding the student's attendance, Progress and Conduct. Students should bring their Parents / Guardians to the HoD / Principal for any discussion regarding the same, as and when required.
- · The hostel students should follow the hostel rules and regulations.
- Eve teasing and ragging are strictly prohibited. Severe action will be taken against
 those who are found to do so. The Principal is empowered to dismiss a student from
 the College, who is found guilty of ragging or gross misbehaviour.

Class Room and Lab Etiquettes

Students are expected

- To be polite, dignified and professional and maintain discipline inside the Campus
- Not to use cell phones in the class rooms.
- To be seated in the lecture hall five minutes prior to the commencement of the class.
- To wear their own lab coats and bring observation / workbook to the laboratory classes regularly.
- To bring their own calculators, drawing instruments, charts, data book, etc. whenever needed.
- · To take care of their belongings/Not to bring any valuables to the College.
- Chewing bubble gum, inside the class room during lecture hours is strictly prohibited
- · To follow the rules / guidelines of Library/Laboratories / Campus.

Leave Form, Permission and Absenteeism

Attendance and Leave Rules

Students must avail leave only after getting permission from the Head of the Department, signed by their Parents and acknowledged by the Class Teacher and HoD at least 24 hours in advance. Emergencies will be considered However, sudden sickness or unforeseen circumstances may be exempted.

When a student is continuously absent for 15 days or more, his / her name will be removed from the rolls without any notice and will be required to seek re-admission only by payment of re-admission fees to the University. If a student is absent for one or more hours in the morning/ afternoon he / she will be marked absent for that whole session.

OD Rules

Any student can avail OD after filling the OD form (available in the Departments) duly signed by the concerned authorities. Any student who is outside the class room during the class hours should possess the ON DUTY pass or Permission letter signed by the HoD.

Identity Card

The Students and Staff are provided with Identity Card which is made compulsory to be worn inside the Campus. They should produce the same when required for verification and identification. If the ID card is lost, the same can be obtained from the office after remitting fee for the Duplicate ID Card.

Certificate Requisition

If a student requires Original Certificate during the course of study or after completion of the Programme, the same shall be obtained by filling the Certificate Requisition Form (available in Administrative Office) duly signed.

Transport Facilities and Regulations

Transport is provided for all the Students.

Only Transport Maintenance Cost will be collected from all the students who are availing transport facility based on their travelling distance.

The Bus maintenance cost is liable to be changed without prior notice which shall be decided based on the changing cost of fuel and maintenance from time to time.

Buses will be plying on all working days as per the prevailing time schedule and is subject to change from time to time based on the changing needs of Institutions. However, during examination time, students will be brought collectively from designated pickup points as decided by authority based on the student strength.

All the students have to possess the valid bus pass issued by the Transport officer or any other authorities authorized by the Management. If the bus pass is not produced during surprise checks, there will be a penalty as decided by the Transport Officer or Head of the Institutions.

The bus route once allotted will not be changed till the end of the course. Students can change the boarding point only when there is a change in permanent residence.

Basic Security Arrangements

Ragging Curb Committee

Ragging Curb Committee comprises of the Principal as the Chairman, Senior Most Professor as Convener, Women Associate Professor, Special Category Lecturer, Incharge of Foreign and Other State Students, Discipline Committee Convener, Staff and Student Representatives as per University norms.

As per the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act, Govt. of India, ragging shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall be liable to a fine which may extend up to Rs. 10,000/-. Any student convicted for offences under section 4 shall also be dismissed from the Institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other Institutions.

Indian Penal Code

There are provisions in the IPC which can be used by a student to register an FIR in the nearest Police Station.

These provisions are:

IPC - 294 : Obscene acts and songs

IPC - 323 : Punishment for voluntarily causing hurt

IPC-324: Voluntarily causing hurt by dangerous weapon or means

IPC - 325 : Punishment for voluntarily causing grievous hurt

IPC-326 : Voluntarily causing grievous hurt by dangerous weapon

IPC-339 : Wrongful Restraint

IPC - 340 : Wrongful Confinement IPC - 341 : Punishment for Wrongful Restraint

IPC-342: Punishment for Wrongful Confinement

IPC - 304 : Punishment for culpable homicide not amounting to murder

IPC-350: Punishment for criminal force

IPC-506: Punishment for criminal intimidation

An undertaking will be obtained from students / parents against ragging, foot board travelling and indulging in criminal activities.

Before the entry, all vehicles will be registered at the entrance gate.

Activities of the students in the College campus including Hostels will be monitored by CCTV cameras at vantage points in consultation with the Police Department.

An Internal Intelligence Wing will inform about the students to the Police Department for appropriate action if they indulge in illegal activities.

Helmet and Driving License are compulsory for those who use vehicle,

Vehicles parked outside of the College gate will be handed over to the Police.

Students will not be permitted to leave the campus before the business hour. Out Pass facilities are available only for emergencies.

Violation of any of the above condition will lead to immediate action on Disciplinary Grounds.

Campus Monitoring Flying Squad

A Campus Monitoring Flying Squad consists of Principal / Members of Faculty / Physical Education Director of the College and two Student Representatives from NSS wing.

Role and Powers of Campus Monitoring Flying Squad

- To check campuses and hostels for attendance / unlawful stay etc.
- b. Ladies hostels shall be checked by the lady warden and lady Faculty Members.
- c. A Committee consisting of five members with Deputy Chief Warden, two members of faculty and two senior students will be formed for both Men and Women hostels to monitor the functioning of Hostels.

Coordination with Police Department

The Campus Monitoring Flying Squad, Hostel Committee, University Level Committee, the Principals, Faculty members, Hostel Wardens will cooperate and coordinate with Police Department for timely and proper action against the erring students/Faculty/other to prevent unlawful activities on and off the campuses.

Police shall be called and requested to extend all co-operation to the College authorities.

General

A Committee at district level is formed to curb such anti-social / criminal / untoward incidents which shall be headed by District Collector with Superintendent of Police as Vice Chairman and with the following members:

- (i) Traffic Police Officers
- (ii) Law and Order Police Officers
- (iii) Principals of Educational Institutions
- (iv) Educationists
- (v) Members of Non-Government Organizations
- (vi) Psychologist/Counselors
- (vii) Concerned Regional Joint Director of Collegiate Education

The committee shall be responsible to review ragging, footboard travelling and antisocial activities / criminal / untoward incidents on / off campuses. The District Collectors / Police shall take necessary immediate follow up action to curb such undesirable activities.

Discipline Committee (nascdc@nehrucolleges.com)

This Committee comprises of Physical Education Director as the Convener along with the Senior Faculty members. It regulates the decorum of the College by maintaining Discipline inside the Campus. In case of any violation of Disciplinary norms by the Student, the Committee convenes meeting and takes corrective measures with the knowledge of the Principal and Management in the presence of their Parents.

Rules and Regulations of the Hostel

- Students are advised to go home only with the Parents/Guardians.
- · Outing is strictly not permitted for the students during examperiod.
- Roll call will be at 07.00 pm every day.
- Strictly adhere to studies between 09.00 pm to 11.00 pm.
- Hostel Main Gate will remain closed from 06.00 pm. to 05.30 am.
- · Inmates should be modestly dressed.
- Should maintain discipline and decorum.
- They should not indulge in ragging.
- Day scholars / No visitors are entertained inside the hostel premises.
- · Wastage of Water and Electricity must be avoided.
- · The inmates should keep their rooms and surroundings clean and neat,
- · Rooms allotted to the inmates are not interchangeable.
- Prior permission must be obtained from the warden for Outing and going home with the knowledge of the Department Authorities.
- The Deputy Chief Wardens (Residential) will take the full responsibility for permitting the students from the hostels.
- The Deputy Chief Wardens (Residential) will forward the students permission forms to the Chief Warden for the approval.
- Whenever, any of the Deputy Chief Wardens (Residential) apply leave, they must make alternate arrangements with any one of the available Deputy Chief Wardens with the knowledge of the Chief Warden.
- While entering and leaving the hostel, students must register their names in the hostel's login register.
- They should strictly adhere to dining hours: Breakfast: 07.30-09.00 am, Lunch: 12.15-01.30 pm, Dinner: 07.00-08.30 pm.
- The decision of the Chief Warden will be the final. Violation of Hostel rules will lead to punishment and dismissal from the Hostel/College.
- Students may be expelled from the Hostel on any one of the following grounds: Theft, Ragging, Abnormal behaviour, Usage of intoxicants, Indiscipline, Violation of rules and non-payment of fees. If the student is expelled on disciplinary grounds, they shall forfeit fee and the deposit.

Hostel Committee

They monitor the discipline and work for the welfare of the inmates. In case of discrepancies, it will be solved by the Committee. They periodically check the Registers, Hostel premises and quality of the Mess Food.

EXAMINATION

Time Table

Time Table for Internal Exams and Model Exam are scheduled and provided in the Hand Book given at the commencement of the every academic year. Semester Examinations - Time Table, Questions Paper and Answer scripts are provided by the College. Details about the Examinations are informed to the students through College notice board which is kept in each floor of the college.

Internal and Model Examinations

Every Semester two Internal Exams for 50 marks and a Model Examination for 75 marks are conducted as a part of Continuous Internal Assessment. Students are awarded internal marks based on their performance in the CIA. It is acknowledged by the students before sending to the University/ Controller of Examinations.

BEST PRACTICES IN CURRICULUM

Centre for Academic Excellence

The College ensures the quality sustenance through organizing and imparts training to the faculty to develop their capabilities for quality in academic delivery that is in line with OBE (Outcome Based Education) requirements. Regular FDPs provide academic orientation on OBE and its implementations.

Bridge Course

Orientation and Bridge Course are conducted for the first year students before the commencement of Academics. The purpose of this course is to bridge the gap between their school and College curriculum. A pre-test and post-test is conducted to analyze the impact of Bridge Course and categorize the students as slow, medium and fast learners and coach them accordingly.

Tutor Ward System and Mentoring

It helps in supporting and encouraging the wards to manage and enrich their learning and feel more confident and self-supporting. All the students are segregated on 20:1 ratio. Each 20 students are being under one Mentor, Mentors take care of their wards in Academic, Personal, Career, Psycho-Social aspects.

Nehru Outbound for Leadership Excellence (NOBLE) is the largest OBT facility in Private Sector in India. It is spread over 3 acres with the capacity to accommodate 120 students to stay and get trained. It helps students to unleash the hidden potential and help them to reinvent themselves.

At NOBLE, we firmly believe that the traits can be learnt best in outbound programmes than in class room. This facilitates an inner view of student's strengths and limitations, there by leading them to powerful individuals.



Entrepreneur Development Cell (EDC)

NASC ABC POLICY

Nehru Arts and Science College has registered under Academic Bank of Credits Scheme in accordance with NEP. National Academic Depository ID is created for NASC to maintain the Credits of students. Institution NAD ID is NAD013096. As per the guidelines of NEP 2020 the College has initiated measures for Academic Bank of Credits. Being the initial stage, all the students have registered in ABC.

The Institution holds functioning MoUs with Foreign and Indian Universities for Students and Staff exchange and Credit Transfer. Hence this is one of the best ways to implement ABC.

The Institution ensures that each student must complete 2 Online Course through SWAYAM / NPTFL / VLAB / INFOSYS Spring Board/IIT Spoken Tutorial etc per year. For every course pertaining credits will be added to the ABC account of the Student/Staff. A student is required to pursue at least 50 per cent of the credits from our institution.

This half of the course makes up the core papers. For the other half the non-core or elective subjects, a student can choose any other Institution or a mix of Institutions registered with the ABC Framework.

The entire elective section can be pursued from another Institution, online or offline or a mix of both. Teachers are motivated and trained in ABC through Faculty Development Programme, and Workshops. Regular reminders and motivation are given to the teachers, by the Head of the Institution, Deans, HoDs, and Staff meetings.
